Although most jazz funerals are for African American musicians there was a new trend in which jazz funerals are given to young people who lost their lives. [5] The funeral organizers organize the band for recruitment as part of the services. When a respected colleague musician or a prominent member of the community of the molds, some additional musicians can also play in procession as a sign of their estimate for the deceased. [6] A typical jazz funeral begins with a march from the family, friends, and a band of brass from home, of funeral pumps or a church at the cemetery.
