Discord server finder by id.

Discord is a great free chat app that's been built for players, but it's handy for anyone. It comes with slack-style text chat, group voice chat channels, and plenty of tools to manage your users. It is a great tool to gather a community or chat with friends while playing. Here's how to configure your server. What is Discord? Discord is very similar to Slack with some extra features designed to help players but honestly, it is a great chat program all around. Normal text chat channels work much like classic IRC-style chat rooms. Anyone (with permission) can enter a room and speak or use slash commands. Discord also offers voice channels that server members can enter to communicate with other members using headphones. So, for example, you could set up a server for your playmates, then create a voice chat channel for Overwatch, Destiny, and Minecraft. He hop into the appropriate channel, and you can talk to anyone who plays that game without disturbing your friends who are in a different game. Don't worry about invitations or creating a new group chat every time you play. Currently you are free to configure a Discord server and there are no limits to the number of users, channels, or even servers you can create. (Discord has information on how he makes money here.) There are already thousands of existing Discord servers for all types of communities and groups that you can browse here (note: some might be NSFW). Whether you want a place for your friends to chat while you play Overwatch, or if you want to build a community of thousands around your hobby of extreme ironing, you can create a server for your needs. How to Create a Discord Server We'll be demonstrating on the desktop version of the Discord app, but the steps should be largely the same on mobile devices. To create your server, open the Discord app (if you don't have it, download it here) and create an account if you don't already have one. Then, click the plus icon in a circle in the server selection column on the left side of the screen. Click on "Create a server" on the left. Give a name to your server under Server Name. Optionally, click the circle on the right to load a thumbnail to represent the server. If you join several assistants, this will be the main way you'll distinguish between them, so choose something unique that identifies your assistant at a glance. Once you've made all your decisions, click Create at the bottom of the window. That's all it takes! Just a few clicks and you will have your own Discord server. Now that you've created your server, you want to make it feel at home. Start by inviting friends to join you. Hover the mouse over text or voice channel and click the Create Instant Invitation icon. In the window that appears, you will get a temporary invitation link. Copy this and share it with anyone you want to add to your server. If they don't already have a Discord account you will be asked to create one when they sign up. By default, these invitations will expire after a day. If you click on the icon of the gear, you can change the duration of their deadline and also limit the number of users who can use a link. You can also add all the voice and text chat channels that you need by clicking on the plus sign next to each section in the Channel column on the left side of the app. Discord has much more to offer than we can deal with just one article, but with your server you are ready to start chatting with your team anywhere and still works for you. Discord is a rapid growth voice and text chat application, especially for players. Its elegant and simple design makes it an excellent alternative to the old apps such as TeamSpeak and Skype. Discord has taken a lot of inspiration from the extensive personalization and management of TeamSpeak management, but has hidden some interface within the interface. Fortunately, it's quite simple to start. How can I create a discord server? Create a DISCORD server is simple. First, you will need to download discord (Windows, MacOS, Linux, iOS or Android) or open the DISCORD web interface. In both cases, you will need to create a free user account to start. So go ahead and do all this before. When you open Discord for the first time and log in, you will be wondered if you want to create or join a server. If you are using the Discord app and you skipped this home screen, you can create a new server by clicking on the large Plus button in the DISCORD interface. In both cases, you will see the same screen. Click the "Create a server" button to create a new server. Give your server name, choose a different region if yours has not been detected correctly, and then click on the "Create" button your new server is created and you automatically connect to it. Select your new server on the left and click on the drop-down arrow next to your name to view options to invite friends, change the server settings, create channels and more. Set user roles to make permissions easier to manage discord roles give users specific permissions. You could, for example, create a role for moderators and give that role the ability to ban the users and delete messages. Any user checks at that role would inherit those authorizations. Using roles save them from duty to assign permissions to each user. You could also use roles to do something as simple as giving your friends a rank and fresh color. To manage roles, open the server settings and click on the category "Roles" to the left. You can add new roles by clicking on the "plus" button on the side of the title "Roles" of the page. Select a role to manage the There is a long list of permissions, but important ones concern the ability to manage the server by creating new channels or roles, managing users by banning or deleting messages, and moving users inside and out of voice chat. There is also an Administrator which gives all permission except server-specific ones (such as deleting the server, for example.) The first setting "The members of the game role separately" will make the people in that role appear in their category in the Users pane. You can do some clean tricks by leaving this setting off for some roles. For example, if you have a group of admins, but want to make you a different color, you can make a new role and put it over the admin, but leave that option off so it won't create a whole new category. Here, we created a "Liquid Color" role and gave it a color. Now, any user assigned to the "Module Color" role will be displayed in blue. You can also use this trick with permissions. For example, you could do a role "Administrator of Server" with the permission of Administrator, and give selectively instead of giving to everyone. Once you've finished setting the roles you want to use, you can assign users to those roles by right-clicking on their name and allowing the appropriate box on the "Roles" menu. If you have a particularly large server, you can search for people under the "Members" tab in the Settings Panel, so you don't have to scroll through the list or @ them. How do I organize channels? Each channel on the server is organized into categories. To create a new channel or category, right-click anywhere in the channel pane and click on "Create Channel" or "Create Category" command. When creating a channel, give it a name and choose whether it should be a text or voice channel. Channel names cannot contain spaces (the drawing of a space only creates a dash) or capital letters. When you create a category, all you have to do is give it a name. Category names may contain spaces, and while you can type uppercase and lower case letters, they end up showing up in all caps, regardless of what. Channels also have their own channel specific permissions, which you can access by clicking on the gear next to a channel. These default permissions to sync with the category the channel belongs to, but if you change them, they will remain that way until you sync again. It is also possible to make categories and private channels. When creating a channel, simply select "Private Channel" and then enable the roles you want to be able to access the channel. If you only want to add a couple of people to the channel, it is best to make a new role for that channel, and then add users to that role. Avoiding Abuse With large discord servers, you need to take some precautions when assigning roles and channels. For example, if you created a private channel and a new role for it, but this role is below another role with "Manage Roles" role, people in that role can give yourself the new private role and access your channel. There are many other cases like this, so here are some guidelines to follow: all the specific roles of the channel should be above the highest administrative role. Personal staff roles placed above admin will give these admins the ability to create new admins, since they are technically superior to admin. "Channel management" also gives people the ability to delete channels, deleting all messages in the process. Because of this, you probably shouldn't assign this permission too much. The same applies to the administrator. In read-only channels, members can still add emoji reactions. Because it's a whole alphabet of emoji, people can say things in response to your messages. You can't delete them, so if you have a problem with people saying things they shouldn't, you can disable this ability under "everyone" in the channel specific settings. You can also hover over the reactions to see who put them there. If you have rogue administrators, the "Log Audit" under the server settings keeps track of all administrative actions, such as deleting messages or banning users. This way you can track down who is causing problems and remove them. If you have a problem with external spam, you can set the auto-mod layer under "Moderation" in the settings. This requires new users to check their email or be an active discord user before joining. If you really need help moderating, you can add a couple of bots that will help you. MEE6 is my personal favorite, with its nice web dashboard and rating system, and Dyno works fine as well. You can browse other discordbots.org bots. discordbots.org.
