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Once you have created a hotmail account, the Microsoft Outlook email client can access the Hotmail account to retrieve e-mail messages. When you no longer need your Hotmail account, you can remove the account from the Outlook software. Open Microsoft Outlook 2010. Click "File" from the main menu. Choose "Info" from the menu list. Select "Account Settings" from the list. Click again on "Account Settings". Select the Hotmail account you want to delete. Click the "Remove" button. Click "Yes" to confirm the cancellation of the account. Open Microsoft Outlook 2007. Click "Tools" in the top menu bar. Select "Account settings" from the list of options. Select the Hotmail account you want to delete. Click the "Remove" button. Click "Yes" to confirm the cancellation of the account. Open the "Start" menu. Click on the "Control Panel". If you are a Hotmail.com user, you've probably heard that Microsoft will close the doors on Hotmail.com and move all its users to the new Outlook.com sometimes this summer. Now I don't know about you, but I hate having things automatically changed for me. I'd rather do it alone. 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(In fact, Microsoft says you can keep your @ hotmail.com forever - even if hotmail.com as entities you will cease to exist in the near future.) Everything will continue to function as it does at the moment, you will only have the new user interface in Outlook.com. Now, it may take some time to learn about some of the new features, but you shouldn't really experience problems creating, sending and receiving e-mail messages. The e-mail addressed to your address @ hotmail.com will arrive in your e-mail address Outlook.com sent by your Outlook.com account will still show your return address as @ hotmail.com. If after updating, you decide to have an email address @ Outlook.com, you can do it easily configuring an alias. Once a configuration of alias, e-mail that you send from an e-mail address of @ Outlook.com and e-mail address at your address @ Outlook.com will arrive in the incoming mail Outlook.com. And you can still send and receive e-mail using your @ hotmail.com address. Cool start if you rarely use your Hotmail.com account, you have not associated accounts or external services, and it has only become a spam magnet you want to eliminate, then you probably want to do a clean starts on Outlook.com. When you do it, nothing is migrated from your existing account. Finish with a brand new account and you can only let your old Hotmail account will vanish - after a complete inactivity period, Microsoft will close the account. However, if after starting fresh, you decide that you would still like to have access to your Hotmail.com account, you have the chance to connect your new and old accounts together. When you do it, you can switch back and forth among them if you need. Keep in mind that the connection of your accounts together does not really combine them - you will have two separate accounts. Now that you have a basic idea on how every method works, they allow you to take a closer look at the details. Update at some point over time, you will access your Hotmail.com account and consult the message shown in Figure A. If at that point it is ready to upgrade, click the Update button in Outlook. If you click the perhaps next button, you may not see this prompt again for a while. If you are like the more cautious people there, it is likely that you clicked the perhaps next button. However, if you now want to update your Hotmail.com account on Outlook.com, you can do it quite easily. Figure a possibility that you have recently seen this message when you are logged in to your Hotmail.com account. To start, make sure you are disconnected of your Hotmail.com account. So point your browser on Outlook.com. When you arrive, you'll see the Outlook.com login page. Now, just log in using your @ Hotmail.com password, as shown in Figure B. Figure B to start the update. On Outlook.com using the e-mail address and password @ hotmail.com. As soon as you log in, the entire update will take place immediately and you will see a welcome message as The one shown in Figure C. Take some time to look beyond the information, check the tips, and watch the video tour. If you are ready to start using Outlook.com, you can simply click the Continue mailbox button. Figure C The current update takes only a few seconds to occur and you will see a welcome message. After upgrading, you will find that all your e-mail and contact messages are just as they were in Hotmail.com. And, since you have the same @ hotmail.com email address and password, you can start using the new tools in Outlook.com to send, receive and manage e-mail. When you log out, you will find that you can access Hotmail.com or Outlook.com. In both cases, you end up in the new Outlook.com interface. In the end, Hotmail.com disappear and typing the address will simply redirect the user to Outlook.com. Setting an alias if after updating, you decide that you would like to have a @ Outlook.com e-mail address, you can set an alias. As I already said earlier, when you set up an alias, you can send and receive e-mails with an @ Outlook.com address and also your @ hotmail.com address. Keep in mind that there are some limitations to the use of an alias. First, you can only create five aka a year. Secondly, you can not access your account using an alias - you will still have to use your @ hotmail.com address. Third, you can only send e-mail from an alias from within the Web-based Outlook.com interface, which means that if you have a Windows Phone and use it to send e-mails, you can only Send e-mails from your @ hotmail.com address. (Microsoft said the situation could change in the future.) To start the process of creating an alias, click the Options icon in the upper right corner of the window and when the menu appears, select the command More post of mail Settings, as shown in Figure D. Figure D To configure an alias, click the Options icon and select the multiple mail command. When the Options screen appears, select the Create an Outlook alias command, as shown in figure E. While you have the Open Options screen, take note that this is the place where you can make changes to customize the mode in Which new account Outlook.com works. Figure e and select the Create an Alias Outlook command on the Options screen. When the Create an e-mail alias screen appears, you need to type a unique name in the text box the e-mail address, as shown in figure F. You can then click the Create an alias button. If the name is not unique, an error message is displayed and will be required to try again. Figure F Type a unique name in the e-mail address text box and click the Create an alias button. You can then go back to the incoming mail and a message will be displayed informing you that the alias has been created and that you can choose to have e-mails sent to your alias in a separate folder, rather than directly in the inbox, as shown in figure g. Of course, you can choose to have you all put your e-mail in the Inbox. I just opted for the default folder name, which is the new email address. Keep in mind that this step simply creates a folder and a rule and that, if you want to change it later, you can make it by editing the rule or rename the folder. Figure G When you return to the incoming mail, you can set a folder to store email sent to your alias. In a few moments, you will receive a new message that that your alias is ready for use, as shown in figure H. Now, based on the information previously displayed, I expected this message would be sent to my new @outlook .com email address and it would appear in my new folder . However, it came to my @ hotmail.com address. It's not a big problem, but not what I expected. Figure H You will receive an email message informing you that your alias is ready for use. After setting your alias, using it requires a quick, but further passage. When you click the New button to create a new message, you will see that your @ Hotmail.com address is the default setting. It is necessary to click on the drop-down arrow next door your email address and then select the @ outlook.com email address from the menu, as shown in Figure I. Figure I When you create a new message, click the down arrow next to your email address and click the right @ outlook.com email address from the menu. A fresh start If you decide you want to make a clean start, make sure you are disconnected from your Hotmail.com account and then point your browser to Outlook.com. When you arrive, do not sign in with your address @ hotmail.com; Instead click the Sign Up Now link at the bottom of the screen, as shown in Figure J. Figure J To start with a fresh Outlook.com account, click the Sign Up Now link. When it does, you need to compile the Microsoft account module, shown in Figure K, as if I were a new user. Along the way, you'll establish your new @ outlook.com email address. Figure K When you start fresh with Outlook.com, you must fill in the form Microsoft account as if you were a new user. Now, you may notice that the information in the top of the screen says that you can rename your account; However, that is no longer the case. During the Outlook.com preview, you can rename your account, but this feature is no longer available on the Options screen is. When you fill out the form and click the "I accept" button at the bottom of the page, you will be taken to a new Outlook.com inbox and can start fresh. Connect your accounts If after creating a new Outlook.com account, you decide that you still want to have access to your Hotmail.com account, you can easily connect to your new account. As I mentioned earlier, when you link accounts together, not actually combine them - you will have two separate accounts. However, you can switch back and forth between them easily within your new account. To begin the process of linking accounts, you click the image icon in the upper right of the window and when the menu appears, you will need to select the Account Control settings, as shown in Figure L. Figure L When click the photo icon, you'll see a menu and select account settings command. When the Microsoft Account screen, select Permissions, and then click the command connected Account Management, as shown in Figure M. Figure M Click the linked account management command. In a moment, you'll see the Manage Account connected and you click the Add account is connected, as shown in Figure N. Figure N Click the Add command linked account. You will be then prompted to enter the password to verify your account information. Then, type the email address and password that you want to link, as shown in Figure O. When finished, simply click the link button at the bottom of the page. You'll then will come back to the linked account management page and a notification is displayed that the two accounts are now linked. Figure O You need to enter the password to verify your account information. Once you've plugged in your account, switching between them it is easy. To do so, click the image icon in the upper right of the window and when the menu appears, you'll see both accounts, as shown in Figure P. To switch between them, simply select the address of email. When you do, you see the Inbox to another account on the screen. To switch Figure P between accounts, just enter the menu and select the account you want to use. What do you think?
